Getting Started at ARE Checklist



You are new, now what should you do? This document is full of information that we hope will be helpful in orienting you to the school. We encourage you to read it in its entirety. However, here are a few next steps you can take right away to help getting you plugged in to our community.

- Sign up to receive emails from the PTA. This is the best way to make sure you are aware of school events. (alstonridgepta.com/signup)
- Join the PTA! Becoming a PTA member supports programs and events that make our school the very best it can be. (alstonridgepta.com/joinus)
- Register to volunteer at ARE. This can only be done on the computer in the front office of the school. Make sure to submit this application at least 2 weeks in advance of the event you are volunteering for. Best to do in the beginning of the year.
- Buy spirit wear for your student to wear on fridays and on field trips

- Put money in your child's school account. Even if you plan to send lunch every day, it is a good idea to put \$10 in his/her account "just in case". If the money is not used, you can get it back. (MySchoolBucks.com you will need your student's school ID #)
- Approve communications from your room parent (ask your teacher...)

- Download the Here Comes the Bus app to your phone if your student will ride the bus. 

About Alston Ridge Elementary

Who Attends Alston Ridge Elementary?

Alston Ridge Elementary (ARE) has a diverse population of families from many backgrounds. Some families have been in the area since ARE was built 10 years ago, and some families have moved from around the country and around the world. There are over 30 languages spoken by our students. Our cultural backgrounds bring a rich opportunity to learn by interacting with families and students with so many experiences, and we are proud of the diversity in our community!

How does Alston Ridge Elementary Function?

ARE educates students from Kindergarten to 5th grade as a year round school with 4 tracks. ARE also houses a preschool program through the Wake County Office of Early Learning. (www.wcpss.net/domain/106)

Year-round multi-track schools were created for two reasons. One is as an efficient way to provide room for the continued population growth in our county. The other is that educational research is clear that year round programs are much better for elementary learning in particular. That means that at ARE at any time, 75% of the students (3 of the tracks) are in the school, and 25% (1 track) are on a break, called “tracked out”. Every track is year round and is “tracked in” for about 9 weeks and “tracked out” for about 3 weeks. All students in all tracks change grade levels in the beginning of July. A year-round multi-track school is unique. Multiple tracks help make a large school feel smaller. You will get to know the students and families in your track better than the rest of the school because you will share teachers and physically be in the school at the same time. You will also notice that many school-wide events such as Science Fair, Field Day, etc, need to be held twice so all students have a chance to participate.

There are some events or activities that only occur once or are year round, which means that students may not be in school for all of them. Examples are Band, which runs year round and may have a concert during your track out, and cultural arts presentations, which happens 4 times, but your student will only see three. Keep a close watch on the ARE and PTA calendars so you don't miss anything! Other forms of communication and sources of information are listed below.

What is a public school?

ARE is a public school in Wake County. Students are assigned to a local public school based on their home address. This is called your “base” school. There is no tuition or application process. However, all students must enroll to become students. Additional information can be found on the Wake County website (<https://www.wcpss.net/Page/33753>)

Being a public school means that our state and local taxes pay for a certain baseline of items at the school such as facilities and teacher salaries. However, there are many additional school needs that benefit our students which are not covered by funding from the county. Some examples are technology (classroom projectors, ipads, etc), color ink, seeds for growing plants, books for our school library, classroom supplies, teacher training, playground equipment, and cultural arts performances. The PTA raises money to pay for these extra expenses. The PTA raises money through a variety of ways including: seeking community sponsorships from local businesses, selling PTA memberships, sponsoring a Fun Run, running a book fair, and scheduling Spirit Nights. But your time is one of the most important resources that benefits our school. Volunteering in the school helps the PTA to run all of these extra programs which provide the students with further opportunities for learning.

What is the ARE PTA?

The Alston Ridge Elementary Parent Teacher Student Association (ARE PTA) is a local chapter of the National PTA, NC PTA, and Wake PTA. It is a registered 501(c)(3) nonprofit, made up of families, students, teachers, staff, and administrators who work together for the success of all children.

The mission of the ARE PTA is to build a community at Alston Ridge between teachers, parents, and students by:

- Supporting our teachers
- Engaging the community
- Empowering families, and
- Creating opportunities to enhance students' learning experience.

When you join the ARE PTA, your membership dues primarily support ARE and a small percentage goes to the state and national PTA organizations where it is used to advocate for child education laws and policies.

Overview of PTA Programs

The PTA is responsible for many favorite programs at ARE, and we are always working to evaluate and improve the experiences for our children. More information is available on the PTA website and following this section in the glossary. Some of the programs run by the ARE PTA are:

Career Fair, Cultural Arts Presentations, 5th Grade Celebration, School Gardens, Gator Fest, Gator Shop (spirit wear and gear), Red Ribbon Week, Reflections, Science Fair, Spirit Nights, Staff Appreciation, Classroom supply stipends, Yearbook, Student Yoga, and more!

We also volunteer for school wide events like Field Day, Gallant Gators, School Beautification, End Of Grade monitoring, etc.

How Do I Stay Informed?

Here are the main general ways to find information:

You should receive communications from:

- Teacher -- Each teacher has their own methods of communication. However, all students have a green folder that is used to send information back/forth from school and home.
- Room Parent – a parent volunteer from your student's classroom to liason with parents, teacher, and PTA
- PTA – Enter your contact information at www.alstonridgepta.com/signup to be added to the PTA mailing list. Information about school events and activities will be sent general info or special info from info@alstonridgepta.com or one of the board member emails on the first page.
- Principal – Mr. Schutte sends periodic updates and announcements from nschutte@wcpss.net
- Wake County – Wake County occasionally notifies parents about county-related information such as weather-related school closures and transportation updates by email, text, and phone messages (<http://bit.ly/sm-infocenter>)

What is That? Glossary of Terms for Alston Ridge Elementary

A=ARE or Teacher program, P=PTA program, C=Community program, \$=fee based

After Care – A,C, \$ - Childcare that is available after school hours from 4:15 pm - 6:00 pm.

Alli the Alligator – P - Our beloved school mascot!

Band – C,\$ - 3-5 graders, run at the school, practicing 2 days after school with several concerts throughout the year alstonridgeband.com

Before Care – A, \$ - Childcare that is available before school hours from 7:00 am - 8:45 am.

Beautification Day – P - A day when parents and students come out and help clean-up and beautify the school grounds. Usually on a Saturday morning and includes things like pulling weeds, spreading mulch, and trash pickup. 2-3 times per year.

Book Fair – P - an opportunity to purchase books for home use and to add to classroom libraries – often in the fall

Box Tops – P - items like cereal boxes and brownie mix may have a square to cut out to turn in and that company will donate money to the school – soon to be scanned by an app also – usually collected twice a year

Career Fair – P, A - presentations by parents and community members to 4th and 5th graders for exposure about their careers – often in February

Carpool – A - Students who are dropped off at school and/or picked up at school by car. (ie, they do not ride the bus or walk). Register at the front desk.

Chorus – A, \$ - 4th and 5th graders, run by the music teacher, meets before school 1-2x/week, 2 concerts per year

Cultural arts – P - 4-5 times per year a presentation by an outside group to provide unique exposure to music groups, dance groups, writing, poetry, art, math or science – usually on a Friday morning in the gym

Curriculum Night (also called Open House) – A - a chance for parents to meet their child's teacher and hear about the overall plan for the year for the class – early in the year, perhaps August

Field Day – A – a half-day event during school where several grades participate in a series of fun active games on the big field – usually in May

First in Fitness – A – a test is taken during physical education classes in grades 3-5 and the top performers practice once a week for a few months prior to a competition trip usually in March

Fun Run – P,C - a school wide event to help raise money for the year's extra programming, often a certain amount is donated per lap the students run – this is usually coordinated by an outside group such as Boosterthon or APEX Leadership

Gallant Gators – A,P - A reading program where parents can come to read to their child's class once a month. The book is related to one of the 8 “gallant gator” character traits and is selected by the guidance counselors.

Gallant Gator Award – A - A Character Development Program run by the guidance counselors and administrators. Peers and teachers nominate students who exhibit one of the “gallant gator” character traits (Respect, Responsibility, Good Judgment, Kindness, Integrity, Courage, Self-Discipline, and Perseverance). Students are recognized during the morning announcements and receive an award certificate.

Gator Fest – P - a carnival-type school-wide celebration, usually in the spring

Green Team – A – 3rd to 5th grade, before school once a week to help with recycling

Here Comes the Bus App – C - An app that you can download to your smartphone which tracks your student's bus and gives you up-to-date information about its locations. (this is helpful for getting your child to/from the bus stop on time!) You will need your student's ID number and the district code (67500) to sign up. (www.wcpss.net/Page/35380)

Kidzart – C,\$ - once a week after school art program

Library helpers – A – once a week before school – the day will be assigned – to help reshelve books and organize in the library

Literacy Night – A - an evening where parents can come to the school to learn more about the specific English work for their child's grade and understand how reading is assessed. Parents will be given ideas and resources for how they can support their child's growing literacy at home.

Math Night – A - an evening where parents can come to the school to learn more about the specific math work for their child’s grade and understand what math benchmarks are used. Parents will be given ideas and resources for how they can support their child’s developing math skills

Red Ribbon Week – P,A - A national program that schools can participate in that focuses on making healthy choices, anti-drugs, and anti-bullying. During Red Ribbon Week, students and teachers often have themed-dress up days - often in October

Reflections – P – school wide art/writing/media contest

Room Parent – P – a class parent who helps to facilitate communication between the parents, the teacher, and the PTA – able to answer questions and help out the class as needed

Safety Patrol – A – 3rd to 5th graders – helping with carpool and bus loading and unloading before and after school – rotates through a week at a time

Scholastic Book Order – A - order forms are sent home periodically with the opportunity to purchase new books to take home, and the orders allow the teachers to select some books for the classroom as well

Science Fair – P - an opportunity for students to conduct and report on an experiment presented for judging and the public with other fun science activities – usually in January

Science Olympiad – A - 5th graders – working with the science teacher to compete in a science-based team competition

Specials – A - each day your child’s class will have one section of the day where they go to an activity outside of reading and math – it rotates each day between physical education, art, media (library), technology, music, science, character education – usually your teacher will post the schedule for the week

Spirit day – A, P - every Friday, students are encouraged to wear “spiritwear” (something with the ARE Alligator on it or the colors blue or green) – the class with the most students wearing spiritwear gets to have the spirit stick for the next week

Spirit night – P - a night, usually about once a month, where a local business will donate part of its profits to the school for patrons who mention ARE – everyone is encouraged to go! This is a great way to meet and mingle with other ARE families.

Spiritwear – P - items for sale with the ARE logo and Alligator – pencils, wristbands, hairbands, tshirts, sweatshirts, etc – these items are sold at most school events by the PTA, and can also be ordered online at alstonridgepta.com/gator-shop

Student Council – A – 3rd to 5th grade, meets before school once a month, a group of students who are more interested in being involved in ARE activities and participate in multiple events

Talent Show – A - An event run by the student council where students (and sometimes teachers!) showcase special talents such as dancing, singing, magic, etc., It is usually in March and, is on an application basis to decide which acts will participate

Staff appreciation week – P - a week where a theme is chosen and something small is brought in for teachers and staff each day, done twice to cover all tracks, usually in May

Teacher work day – A - there is no school on these days so teachers can participate in development activities

Track in – A - your child is in school, 3 tracks are in at the same time

Track out – A - your child is on break, 1 track is on break at a time

Track Out Camp – C,\$ - Camps that are offered for a fee by local businesses during track outs.

TGA Tennis and Golf – C,\$ - after school sports programs run by TGA at the school - playtga.com/wakecounty/

Yearbook – P, \$ - a book of pictures of all the students from the fall picture day – a memento to remember their time at ARE

Yoga – P – once a week before school program, need to register
